Updates

- HiPerGator 2.0 is now fully operational. The HPL benchmark was run and produced 738 Tflops, which puts it at #114 in the top500.org list. It is the 2nd university funded system among US public universities and 3rd among all US universities. It is clearly distinguishable from the two systems ahead of it because it has 30,000 cores that are useful for the full spectrum of HPC and Big Data users. The 1st ranked system is at Purdue and it has 1,000 Intel Xeon Phi accelerators, which are only useful to a small (but growing) set of users. The 2nd ranked system is an IBM Blue Gene system at Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute that is very energy efficient and fast but also for a limited set of users, in particular those with highly parallel applications.
- The Informatics Institute now has its official space.
- The Informatics Institute has two calls out
 - o for graduate student fellowships, and
 - o for postdoctoral fellowships.

Both are intended to foster collaborations among faculty and researchers at UF and beyond.
