2. **Work In Progress – Quick Updates**

- **File Express (drop box)**

Shawn Lander

- Shawn Lander gave a live demo of the product originally developed by/for the UF College of Engineering, currently being adapted for general UF use. The service is available for unofficial 'secret' beta at <https://file-express.ufl.edu/folder.php>. Please do not publish this info yet.
- Issues/Questions:
 - Expiration of folder defaults to 1 day – OK
 - Maximum lifetime of 2 weeks – change to 7 days
 - For both of the above, the committee recommended being explicit regarding the TIME-of-day the expiration job runs (currently ~ 01:00AM)
 - Available quota:
 - System has 100GB TOTAL
 - Allows maximum of 1GB upload-batch-size (somewhat artificial, imposed by the JQuery tool they're using to interact with users).
 - Committee suggested that 5GB would be good for this value
 - Cromer suggests a table showing typical/likely upload time for files, to help users gauge how long it will take
 - Tiered quotas: shorter expirations for folders exceeding size-limits? – NO
 - Exceptions: Should they be allowed? – NO, not now
 - Review: Does this need to be reviewed by Privacy, InfoSec, General Counsel? – Tim will advise InfoSec (Adams), so they can decide what reviews should be done.
- C. Benjamin suggests asking UF Computing Help Desk to feed back user comments
- Committee would like assistance from E. Deumens (HPCC) to promote this service to his user community, as they are likely to be particularly interested

- **Fax Server (pilot)**

John Madey

- Had pilot w/IFAS & CLAS ("mini-pilot"/Proof-of-Concept)
- Next step – Dan Cromer & Scott Matusz to get the service expanded in their colleges
- Outbound Faxing only available so far. Inbound still has issues that need work-thru
- People definitely want to keep their current inbound fax #s

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- Madey looking to come back to this committee in January with a roll-out document
- Working with help desk on documentation
- Dan Cromer says outbound is “99%” done/ready
- Question from C. Benjamin about legal requirement to have fax # in header. Right now the fax server doesn’t do that. Additional research needed. (Cromer would like it to say “From University of Florida Fax Server.”)
- C. Benjamin says his unit has been trying a similar service, but users seem to be resistant to actually switching to it. They’re habituated to their old physical fax-machines, and that seems to be hard to re-train.
- Need to move the current PRI over from Bridges to the production VoIP PRI
- Hopes to be open for business by end of Jan
- **Voice-mail forwarding to E-Mail** **John Madey**
 - Probably 20% of eligible users complete
 - Added College of Education, and Operations Analysis. Going “door-by-door” asking if units want to ‘sign up’
 - So far, so good
 - If you are on VoIP AND Exchange, and you want in, let John know.
- **ECDC Groundbreaking – Nov 29 at 3:30** **Tim/David**
- **Service Catalog – need Focus Group feedback** **Tim/Barb**
 - We’ve collected data from all central providers
 - Being put in draft format on web
 - Soon we’ll have a menu/portfolio of services for preview by focus group. Volunteers needed. Tell Tim if you’re interested.
 - Expect the focus group to get it during the 1st couple weeks in January
 - There is much interest in COSTING of catalog: how does the IT budget spread across the catalog. That’s “Phase 2.” Sedesse & Tim will work with B. Cauthon who will do the cost slice-n-dice.

3. Year In Review – Quick Status

Tim

Project Status – This Year – 3 categories:

- Done
- In Progress
- On Hold
- plus Ongoing Operations – all the day-in and day-out stuff

New Initiatives – for Next Year

- Cloud Storage: Elias is promoting this heavily. Moffat will be evaluating vendors and prices.
 - FLR is talking about doing this – aka the Community Cloud
 - FLR might sell it – then have one of the FLR members host it

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- Infrastructure Hardware Replacement Lifecycle:
 - May need to stretch replacement cycles due to budget cuts
 - Similar issues for Wall-Plate refresh cycle
- Network Bandwidth Upgrades:
 - 30% more Internet – plus FLR peering
 - 10 Gig between all Core POPs – about half done
 - 1 Gig between Core and Building POPs – about half done
- Data Center Deferred Maintenance – CRACs, UPSs, PDUs – nearly caught up

4. Membership Rotation – Guidelines/Discussion

Tim

- Members
 - First Year – all 6 Advisory Committees started Jan 2011
 - SIAC met 11 times this year – thanks to all for contributing
 - Next Year: Policy Council is suggesting:
 - In general – 2 year membership terms – staggered
 - For startup years – needs some adjustments
 - ~ May 2012 – ½ the members turn over
 - ~ May 2012 – ½ the members stay on
 - Note that Student Rep (Ben Brasch) and Faculty Rep (Prabhat Mishra) could not be here this Fall due to schedule conflicts. Hope to find a time in January that can accommodate them.
 - C. Benjamin asks about the impact of the UF Academy (students attending Spring/Summer only) with the committee cycle. No one had any information.
 - Policy Council clarified roles of “Regular Members” vs. “ex officio” vs. “Subject Matter” experts. Tim wants to acknowledge contribution of the SMEs to this committee; (W. Curry, J. Madey, D. Miller, I. Moffat, D. Pokorney, et al)
- Chair
 - Policy Council wants a **chair-person-elect** to be named soon; and become chair in May 2013. Tim will ask SIAC members to volunteers, and pass their names on to Elias.
